

New Zealand Earthquake Benefit Organ Recital by Nigel Potts

Dear Friends,

n November 14th 2016, parts of New Zealand suffered a severer earthquake which measured 7.8 on the richter scale. Fortunately there were only two deaths as it mostly affected a rural area in the middle of the night. However less than 150 miles away, my home city of Wellington suffered some damage. The retirement apartment building next door to my mother's apartment is presently being



demolished, as is the building next door to Wellington Cathedral. As a result the Cathedral has been closed since the earthquake until demolition is completed. Whilst the reinforced concrete structure of the Cathedral building did not suffer damage, the organ is now sadly unplayable from damaged caused by 16 foot pipes crashing down into the organ chamber (and choir stalls some distance below). With the Cathedral closed, it is undetermined yet if the organ will require a major repair or restoration, or even a new instrument. Either way, the smallest project won't be inexpensive. Wellington Cathedral and its organ have been an important part of my family's life and especially for me. My parents were married there in 1964 and remained very active until recently. In 1980, as an 8 year old chorister probationer, I remember attending the organ recital dedicating the enlarged rebuild of the organ. I played this organ for the first time when I was 11 and then at 17 became the Organ Scholar. This gave me the required experience to continue working in English Cathedrals. Fast forward 24 years, I last played this organ for my Father's funeral last May. Given the importance this cathedral organ has had on my life, the Dean and I thought it would be a good idea for me to offer an organ recital at Grace to raise funds for the repair of the organ as a result of the earthquake.

This concert will be on **Friday, February 3rd at 7:00pm**. The program will include *Kiwi Fireworks – Five variations on God Defend New Zealand* by British composer Paul Spicer (a work written after I introduced the NZ National Anthem to the composer) and at the request of many Grace members who missed my Piccolo Spoleto concert last May, the program will also include my transcription of *Elgar's Sea Pictures*, sung by Sarah Rose Taylor.

I hope you will be able to attend this concert and support this worthy cause.

If you are unable to attend, but wish to donate to the cause, you are welcome to send a check payable to 'Grace Church Cathedral' with 'Wellington Cathedral Organ' in the memo line. All donations will be most gratefully received.
